The successful candidate will have an earned doctorate in mathematics education with a strong background in mathematics (preferably a master's degree in one of the mathematical sciences) or an earned doctorate in mathematics with research experience in elementary mathematics education. Doctoral candidates who are ABD will be considered if their defense date is expected to be by the end of 2011. We seek applicants who have demonstrated high quality teaching of undergraduate students.

Responsibilities include teaching undergraduate mathematics courses; coordinating the mathematics program; advising and mentoring students; conducting research and/or engaged scholarship in mathematics education; serving on college and university committees; and serving the mathematics community of educators, researchers, and professionals.

Instructional responsibilities include being willing and able to teach all of the following courses: developmental math courses, Finite Mathematics, Pre-calculus through Calculus II, Calculus for the Life Sciences. Instructional responsibilities may also include one undergraduate/graduate mathematics education course per year; specifically for in-service and pre-service elementary mathematics teachers. A typical teaching load is three 4-credit courses per semester.

Send application letter, vitae, transcripts (official or unofficial), copies of all teaching evaluations from the past three years, a statement of teaching philosophy, and at least three letters of reference.
