

**Assistant/Associate Professor in Mathematics Education
School of Teaching and Learning
College of Education**

The School of Teaching and Learning in the College of Education at the University of Florida seeks a scholar in the field of mathematics education at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor. This is a nine-month, tenure-track position to begin August 2013.

Applicants for this position should have a record of scholarship in the field of mathematics education. The successful applicant will be expected to maintain a well-developed, systematic line of research; pursue external funding; facilitate interdisciplinary research with colleagues at the University of Florida and other institutions; contribute to advanced graduate studies in STEM education; and recruit and mentor doctoral students. This tenure-track faculty member will join an active research community of STEM education faculty and doctoral students committed to the pursuit of the highest level of scholarship. The STEM education faculty currently holds research grants from the Institute of Education Sciences, National Science Foundation, and U.S. Department of Education. The faculty also participates in several collaborative and interdisciplinary projects with funding from state and national agencies as well as private foundations such as the Howard Hughes Medical Institute, National Math and Science Initiative, and Helios Education Foundation.

Responsibilities:

- Scholarly activities commensurate with expectations of a tenure-track faculty member at a research-intensive university
- Active participation and collaboration with the STEM Education faculty and graduate students
- Pursuit of external funding in collaboration with colleagues within and outside the College of Education
- Advising and mentoring graduate students
- Teaching undergraduate- and graduate-level courses
- Service to the program, department, college, university, and profession

Qualifications

- Doctorate and experience in mathematics education, or a closely related field
- Record of scholarly productivity
- Established and recent record of writing, securing and successfully managing grants or clear evidence of ability to do so
- Demonstrated commitment to collaboration
- Strong knowledge of a variety of research methods
- Record of teaching excellence
- Record of mentoring graduate students
- Active leadership in professional organizations
