### Clinical Assistant Professor in Mathematics Education at the University of Florida

The School of Teaching and Learning (<http://education.ufl.edu/school>) in the College of Education at the University of Florida (Gainesville, FL), a comprehensive land-grant research university, invites applications for a clinical assistant professor in mathematics education to begin in the Fall 2013 semester. This is a 9-month, non-tenure track position, with the likelihood of summer employment and renewed annual contract. The University of Florida is strongly committed to the diversity of its workforce. Applicants from diverse backgrounds are strongly encouraged to apply.

#### Responsibilities

- Teach undergraduate and graduate students in mathematics education
- Provide coordination for and leadership of mathematics education programs
- Advise students in the M.Ed. program to prepare secondary mathematics teachers
- Engage in traditional, blended, and online program development
- Collaborate with faculty and doctoral students on scholarship related to mathematics education

#### Required Qualifications

- Evidence that doctorate will be earned by December 2013 in curriculum and instruction (with appropriate focus), mathematics education, or closely related field
- Experience teaching mathematics education courses in higher education
- Strong interpersonal and organizational skills
- Evidence of exemplary teaching, scholarly activity, and collaboration

#### Desired Qualifications

- Experience with online course development and online teaching
- Experience with both quantitative and qualitative research methodologies
- K-12 teaching experience
- Equivalent of master's degree in pure or applied mathematics

Applicants will need to upload to the University of Florida's Gator Jobs website (1) a letter of application addressing qualifications and describing required and desired qualifications, (2) a curriculum vita, and (3) three letters of reference that address the candidate's qualifications, and (4) contact information for at least three additional references to be contacted during the search process. Applications will be reviewed beginning on February 27, 2013 and the position will be open until filled or a highly qualified applicant is found.
