Tenure Track Position in Mathematics Education Department of Mathematics and Statistics Bowling Green State University

The Department of Mathematics and Statistics at Bowling Green State University invites applications for a tenure-track position in mathematics education at the rank of Assistant Professor starting August, 2012.

Candidates holding a doctorate in mathematics education or related field, and specializing in any area of mathematics education are encouraged to apply. Candidates are expected to have completed all requirements for a doctorate in mathematics education or related field before August 1, 2012. Preference will be given to applicants who have a masters in mathematics or statistics, a history of working with schools at the K-12 level as well as recent collegiate teaching experience, experience in reform-based curricula, and experience using technology in mathematics education courses. The successful candidate will have a strong research record in mathematics education, have the potential to obtain external funding, interact with current faculty and graduate students, help the department maintain a thriving set of undergraduate and graduate courses tailored for preservice and inservice mathematics education teachers and direct undergraduate and graduate student research projects. Usual duties consist of teaching, conducting scholarly research, supervising graduate students, seeking external funding, and participating in service activities.

The department offers the content courses for licensure in elementary, middle and secondary mathematics education as well as a Masters of Arts in Teaching degree. The bachelor's programs in mathematics, statistics, and mathematics education attract approximately 250 majors. The graduate program has 60 full-time students with approximately 5-10 full-time and part-time graduate students pursuing an MAT degree in Mathematics that involves specific coursework and research experiences.

The University celebrated its 100th anniversary in 2010 and enrolls approximately 15,000 undergraduates and 3,000 graduate students. The city of Bowling Green offers a small town atmosphere, yet is located within a half-hour drive of Toledo, a large metropolitan area. In addition to our own battery of research seminars, members of the department frequently participate in seminars at the University of Michigan and The Ohio State University, which are within an easy driving distance of BGSU. Bowling Green City Schools are among the best in the region. Cultural and social activities at the University and in the Toledo area, together with low cost of living, make Bowling Green one of the most desired locations in Ohio.
