POSITION: One tenure-track position in Mathematics education

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The Hope College Department of Mathematics invites applications for one tenure-track position in mathematics education to begin Fall 2012. Primary responsibilities include teaching (typically 5 courses per year) and research (including working with undergraduates). A PhD (or equivalent) is required. In addition, the candidate must have a Masters degree (or equivalent) in Mathematics. Experience teaching at the elementary or middle school level is strongly desired, and experience with outreach to in-service teachers is desired as well. Applications will be reviewed on December 15, 2011 and the search will continue until the position is filled.
