The University of North Carolina at Greensboro invites applications and nominations for the James D. and Johanna F. Yopp Distinguished Professorship, a tenure track full-professor position in the Department of Teacher Education & Higher Education, School of Education, University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Applicants should have a focus on mathematics education with a proven record of research and leadership.

UNCG, one of 16 campuses in the University of North Carolina system, is classified by the Carnegie Foundation as a research university with high research activity. It has an enrollment of approximately 16,700, including 3,500 graduate students. Both the College and the School of Education offer a wide range of undergraduate, Master's, and doctoral degree programs. The two academic units cooperate in the preparation of teachers through the Teachers Academy, a faculty body that admits students to teacher education programs and coordinates those programs between the College and the School. The University has an excellent cooperative relationship with the Guilford County Schools, one of the largest school systems in the state.

Greensboro is a medium-sized city of about 220,000 in the Piedmont Triad Region of North Carolina near the Research Triangle and other doctorate granting institutions, a location providing easy access to recreational opportunities at the beach and the mountains. The local metropolitan area (which includes the cities of High Point and Winston-Salem) has a population of almost 1 million and offers an excellent quality of life. Qualifications for mathematics positions:

- 1. Earned doctorate with an emphasis in mathematics education.
- Demonstrated commitment to mathematics teacher education, equity in mathematics education, working in urban settings, and/or collaborative/interdisciplinary models of research

3. Demonstrated scholarship (e.g., publications, presentations) in appropriate areas of expertise.

## Responsibilities:

- 1. Provide leadership in the department regarding teaching, program quality, grant writing, and research.
- 2. Meet expectations for scholarship and grant writing appropriate for Doctoral/Research Intensive institution.
- 3. Teach undergraduate and graduate courses and advise graduate students in their studies.
- 4. Contribute to the overall instructional, research, and service mission of the School of Education.

Review of applications will begin on November 1, 2011, and will continue until the position is filled. Effective date of all positions will be August 1, 2012. Applicants should submit electronically a vita, a statement describing their program of research, representative publications, and the email addresses of three references.
