

Adjunct Summer Lecturer and Director of Secondary Mathematics Studies Education

Brown University's Department of Education seeks an outstanding teacher and teacher educator to serve as an adjunct Lecturer in Education and Director of Mathematics Education for the Brown Summer High School Program. The responsibilities include: (1) development of a Methods in Secondary Mathematics course to be taught to summer undergraduate interns (beginning June 15, ending July 31); and (2) collaboratively work with a local mathematics teacher/mentor in providing feedback to the interns during the 7 week summer semester. The undergraduate student interns will develop and teach a 4 week summer mathematics course to urban secondary students attending Brown Summer High School. The successful candidate will be paid a very generous stipend, depending on her/his qualifications.

Qualifications

Applicants must have at least a master's degree, in mathematics education and experience in teaching a mathematics methods course. Applicants must also have significant experience in secondary teaching and in the teaching and supervision of new teachers; an ability to work closely and productively with colleagues; a deep knowledge of the issues of secondary mathematics education, multicultural issues, and adolescent development; significant awareness of current issues in schooling and teacher education; and special skills and experience in working with urban and minority populations.
