Postdoctoral Position in Community Engaged STEM Learning**

Mathematizing, Visualizing, and Power (MVP): Appalachian Youth Becoming Data Artists for Community Learning Learning is a three-year NSF-funded project that focuses on developing and testing a model for community-centered data exploration catalyzed by youth. The project develops quantitative data artistry among young people in East Tennessee communities and enables these youth to share their data visualizations with their communities to foster collective reflection and understanding. The project is led by PIs Lynn Hodge, Elizabeth Dyer, Joy Bertling, and Carlye Clark and includes a dynamic and diverse team.

We seek a postdoctoral fellow to advance the community engaged design, research, and development work of the project. This fellowship will provide opportunities for a junior research to the project's goals while gaining research, partnership building, and project coordination experience.

The project is based in the College of Education, Health, and Human Sciences (CEHHS), a leading educational research institution, located in Knoxville, Tennessee. Applicants should have a completed doctoral degree in STEM education, teacher education, urban education, or a related field. Preferred qualifications include experience working with communities as part of informal learning contexts, expertise in culturally relevant pedagogy, and experience with data science/statistics education.

This position is a full-time, twelve-month appointment with a salary of \$60,000, with health/dental insurance, a travel allowance, and other benefits.
