- An earned doctorate in Mathematics Education or its equivalent
- A minimum of 3 years teaching experience in grades K-12
- Evidence of ability to teach undergraduate and graduate mathematics education coursework and advise at the graduate level
- Evidence of professional institutional and national service, appropriate to rank
- Demonstrated record of nationally visible scholarly activity, appropriate to rank
- Demonstrated record of seeking external funding, appropriate to rank
- A commitment to access and equity

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- A record of participation in funded projects (particularly in securing external funding)
- Experiences in interdisciplinary program/course development
