- Evidence of experience teaching undergraduate and/or graduate courses in or relating to mathematics education
- Evidence of experience with or preparedness for advising graduate students
- Evidence of professional service
- Demonstrated record of scholarly activity
- A record of participation in funded projects
- A commitment to access and equity

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- 5 or more years teaching experience in grades K-12.
- 3 or more years teaching experience in grades K-8.
- Demonstrated record of seeking funding.
- Experiences in interdisciplinary program/course development, particularly in STEM education.
